## Family, Nutrition & Health

Nutrition programs, such as FF-NEWS, Smart Choices and others provide research-based information to help individuals and families increase their nutrition knowledge, gain skills in healthy food preparation, and improve eating and activity habits in order to live a healthy lifestyle. The issue of Childhood Obesity has been adopted as a major initiative. Programs such as Family Nutrition Night and Smart Bodies address this issue and promote healthy lifestyles through hands-on educational activities for children, parents and caregivers. School garden projects teach the value of food and enhance skills in health, math and social growth for youth and families.

### 4-H Youth & Family Development

Program initiatives strive to promote innovative learning -by-doing educational experiences to engage a diverse population of youth, families and volunteers. 4-H programs promote literacy and life skill development utilizing a research-based curriculum, a mobile technology lab and project-based hands-on learning experiences. Southern University Y.E.S. program strengthens learning in reading, writing, math and science by developing new skills, increasing self-confidence and encouraging youth and families to contribute through service to their community. Youth and families also benefit from outreach efforts in resource management, financial literacy education, parenting and childcare series.

#### Agriculture & Natural Resources

Located in the Northeast Louisiana in the heart of the Mississippi River Delta, Madison program efforts include working with innovative producers to utilize precision agricultural farming methods, making recommendations for row crop commodities and researching irrigation problems resulting from salt water intrusion in irrigation wells. On-going collaboration with Ag Economists includes collection of data on production loss as a result of high river levels and continuing drought. As one of two GIS specialists for the AgCenter in North Louisiana, our local programming efforts have provided training for producers on how to better utilize precision agriculture technology in farming operations. Special programs include field days, demonstration plots on local farms and at the Northeast Research Station, and regular farm visits. With data collected on local farms, producers are able to make better management decisions to increase returns on investments.


#### How we are funded.

- 1. Increase productivity and profitability of Louisiana Agriculture.
- -Conduct parish Aq Day
- -Conduct on farm variety trials for evaluation of specific varieties in local production environment
- -Conduct verification field with LSU AgCenter specialist to assure recommendations are effective/economical
- -Develop a precision agriculture demonstration/to help producers become more proficient with emerging technology
- -Conduct farm and home visits with ag producers and home owners to assist as needed

# 2. Promote the wise use of natural resources and protection of the environment.

- -Work with producers to evaluate irrigation wells for performance and salinity content
- -Youth to increase an appreciation for agriculture and how food is produced utilizing school garden projects

# 3. Build leaders and good citizens through 4-H Youth and Family development.

- -Community partners to collaborate to enhance year-round learning opportunities for parish youth and families
- -4-H members to build belonging, independence, mastery and generosity through heightened learning opportunities utilizing technology-based resources and hands-on activities
